Two short months ago we had just finished the fall Walks, we had scheduled the 2005 Walks and it was time to relax and take a breather. That all changed a bit on the news of Camp Easter

Seals' closure. Once the shock wore off, the search for a new site was on. We'll be back on track in no time given all of the possibilities. Why there's that 4H Camp in Front Royal... "I'm sorry sir, we are booked through next December". OK, how about the Roslyn Center near Richmond... "We'll take applications in the spring of 2005 for the spring of 2006". There's always that rustic Camp Hanover that our youth go to each year. Do you have any idea what "rustic" really means! Well, the Chrysalis Community used Prince William Forest Park once or twice; if they can do it, so can we. Perhaps the youth come from heartier stock than we do; in any case, I'm not sure I could have faced the Community to explain that choice.

As the searching continued (and panic began to set in), rumors of a possible site somewhere west of Fredericksburg began to surface. Then a name, Camp Happyland; and finally an organization, The Salvation Army. I contacted The Salvation Army and made plans for several of us to visit. We were pleasantly surprised by what we found...ecstatic is probably a better

word. A location that could easily handle all of our needs. As we walked about the site with the Caretaker, he mentioned that they had been there for the past 30 years or so, but had just begun to rent to organizations outside of The Salvation Army. What a coincidence! Just as Camp Easter Seals closed down, Camp Happyland opened up.

Of all of our Emmaus activities, Candlelight is the best attended, and it's common to have over 250 in attendance. Seating is another story, though, as we usually have standing room only. Did you know that there's a very nice chapel at Camp Happyland that seats 450 people? And the chairs are already in place! What a coincidence; as we approach capacity at one site, another site opens with much more space.

Closing is another story. Attendance is not nearly as large as at Candlelight. Perhaps one of the problems is the distance we had to drive. For those in Fredericksburg, Camp Happyland is about half as far away as Camp Easter Seals. What a coincidence; another obstacle removed for many to attend.

On several occasions, we have scheduled a third women's Walk during the year to cut down on some of the backlog of applications. Some have suggested having more pilgrims on a Walk, but given the size of the rooms at Camp Easter Seals, that wasn't really an option. At least two of the meeting rooms at Camp Happyland can easily hold one more table,

perhaps two! What a coincidence, a location that offers us the flexibility to expand our Walks if we wish!

I could go on, but I think you get the picture. How many coincidences do you need to see to understand that there is a greater power at work; that what we are seeing is the hand of God and not really a series of coincidences? As one door closed to our Community, God opened another door; and He opened it wide. He is leading us forward and presenting us with the opportunity to do even greater things through faith.

We have begun a new chapter in the life of the Fredericksburg Emmaus Community. It's an incredibly exciting time...it's a time to rediscover God in our midst. Savor this moment!

Board News



God has continued to bless our Community. Just as the doors were closed to us for Camp Easter Seals, He opened the door to Camp Happyland. During January, The Salvation Army has approved our first application to hold a Walk at their facilities in Spotsylvania County. Just prior to the Board meeting this month, most of the members of the Board and the Cadre from each of our 2005 Spring Walks toured the new facilities. We began the process of examining all we do and determining how best to adapt to our new surroundings. Of the 20 or so folks that visited the Camp, we had about that many ideas on how to best utilize the facilities! Needless to say, we have some further planning to do.

The Treasurer, Monica Warne, reported a balance of \$5,161.27 in the bank as of December 31^{st} . Of this amount, \$2,439.96 has been collected over the years for scholarship funds. While this sounds like a lot, the change in Walk location to Camp Happyland will require us to do things a bit differently than in the past and these additional funds may become necessary. At Camp Easter Seals, we paid a deposit of \$500 in advance of a Walk and they billed us the balance (about \$9,500) a couple weeks after the Walk. At Camp Happyland, however, our deposit is closer to \$1,000 and the balance is due on arrival. As we get ready for E57 and future Walks, we will be asking Team members and Sponsors to collect and turn in the fees no later than two weeks prior to the Walk.

Dick Barnett from the 4^{th} Day Ministry Committee reported progress on the Pilgrim selection and sponsorship guidance. Dick provided recommendations for approval (and received that approval) and also reported a list of remaining actions for the 4^{th} Day Ministry to complete. The 4^{th} Day Ministry hopes to have completed action no later than the March Gathering.

The Emmaus Directory has been printed. Now we have the task of collating all that paper! Mark Dunn has 15,000 pages in stacks around his office. We should have directories ready for distribution at our February Gathering.

The Board approved an Amendment to our By-Laws to change the name of our Community from "The Upper Room Emmaus of the Greater Fredericksburg Area" to "The Upper Room Emmaus of the Greater Fredericksburg Area, $\underline{Inc.}$ ". This change is necessary as we finally apply to the IRS for 501(c)(3) status. We presented this change to the Gathering and will vote on it during the February Gathering.



Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

"Beep, Beep, Beep, Beep!" The alarm clock screamed at me as I struggled out of a sound sleep to turn it off. Have you ever noticed that

some alarm clocks sound similar to a truck's back up alarm?

I stumbled to the bathroom, turned on the water faucet,

and splashed lukewarm water on my face. As I looked into the mirror, I was stunned by what I saw. I saw what appeared to be my father staring back at me.

It was as if time stood still. I was transported to another time and place. I was twelve years old, listening to my father talk to me. We were in the service station, and he was showing me how to replace a car's water pump. He showed me how to scrape the old gasket off of the block and prepare the surface for the new water pump. I helped him start all the bolts. Then he showed me how to tighten the bolts by starting at the center bolts and working outward. Afterward, he began reattaching the hoses. He said, "See these hoses are still in good shape. Many mechanics would replace the hoses and charge the customer for something they did not need. I believe there is plenty of money to be made honestly without cheating a customer." It's amazing how the words of my father stuck in my mind as he taught me a lesson in integrity. I remember his kind face as he instructed me, the smear of grease on his cheek and nose. He would always say, "Why is it when you get grease on your hand, your nose itches?" We would both laugh as we looked at each of our greasy faces.

The laughter disappeared as I stood listening to my father say, "Do like I say, not like I do! I want your life to be better than my own. I want you to finish school and do something with your life. I don't want you working in a service station all of your life. I want things to be easier for you." Oh, how I despised the phrase, "do what I say, not like I do." Today I realize that what he really meant was he loved me enough to want my life to be better. He had felt he had to work so hard for so little. He wanted only the best for his son.

The image faded as a new one appeared. I was sixteen years old, and my father and I were sitting inside the court house of a neighboring town. I had received a speeding ticket and had to appear before the juvenile judge. We both are dressed in suits and ties in silence as we wait. I was with a friend the night I received the ticket. We were driving around, listening to music, visiting friends, and enjoying the freedom of being teenagers on a Saturday night. I loved the way my dad's car performed, and I had become a fast driver. Telling my father was a much bigger concern than actually receiving the ticket. On the way home that night, we decided to visit a party that we had heard about. I turned onto a country road with no painted centerline. As I drove, we witnessed a car in front of us run another car off the road striking a tree. The other car did not stop. I stopped, and we got out to help, discovering the driver and passenger were friends of ours. The driver was okay but the passenger was hurt. I drove him to the doctor as my friend stayed behind with the driver. The doctor sewed up the passenger's head as I sat in shock.

Later that night, as I rode with my father to tow the car in, I broke the news to him about

the ticket. A long lecture began and with it a grounding for a week. I knew I deserved it. Harsh as my father seemed, I knew he could have made things worse. I was worried about losing the driver's licence. I had waited for so long, knowing the judge could take it away.

As I sat in the court house, remembering the events that lead up to this day, I felt nervous about going before the judge. I was comforted by my father being with me. Appearing before the judge is a blur to me. I know I received a fine, but my licence was not taken. What I remember most was seeing my dad smile and overhearing his conversation with someone after the court appearance. He had mentioned how proud he was of me. I know he didn't approve of what I had done, but he stood with me. His unconditional love for me was more powerful than my mistake.

The court house fades, and we are sitting in a hospital room. I was twenty-three and dad was propped up with pillows in a hospital bed. He was resting after his heart attack with an oxygen tube in his nose, and an IV tube in his arm. It was just he and I in the room. He joked about smoking cigarettes saying, "I could smoke a cigarette as big as a telephone pole right now!" We laughed and the mood went back to the seriousness of his condition. He stroked his face and remarked how he needed a shave. He asked me to shave him, and I did. Afterward, he shared with me the probability of his not making it out of the hospital alive. He reached for me, hugging me, as we both cried. He told me he loved me, and I told him I loved him

The white of the hospital turned to cold gray granite as I stood in the cemetery looking at my father's tombstone. I remember wondering if my father could see me, and if he would approve of what I had become. I wanted to talk with

him and touch him once more, but I knew I could not. I felt so lonely and cold standing there trying to make sense of his death. All I could say to myself was, he loved me and gave me all he had.

"Beep, Beep!" My alarm clock awoke me from a sound sleep. I reached over and silenced the alarm and sat up in bed analyzing the dream I had just had. It felt so real!

As I talked with God during my morning prayer time, I was reminded of 1 John 4:19. "We love because He first loved us." I realized at that moment it's not about my father seeing me, but it's about me carrying my dad with me wherever I go. My dad had given me a piece of himself. He is always with me as I remember all of the things he taught me. I believe that my father would not have been the dad he was without God's love being shown to my father first.

Today when I looked in the mirror, I looked at my reflection and smiled knowing God's love will always be with me. He showed my dad how it works, and I pass this on to you. Love is the only thing that multiples when you give away. Try it today. Pass it on!

PROPOSED CHANGE TO THE FREDERICKSBURG EMMAUS BY-LAWS

The following change to the Fredericksburg Emmaus By-Laws was approved by the Board of Directors on January 8, 2005. The purpose of the change is to align the name of our Community in the By-Laws with the name under which we are incorporated with the Commonwealth of Virginia. This is a necessary step as we apply for tax exempt status under Internal Revenue Code section 501°)(3).

At the February 2005 G athering, we will allow the Community to vote on this change as required by our By-Laws.

Addendum VII to By-Laws

Having been through the process for Amendments as prescribed in Article VIII of the by-laws for The Upper Room Emmaus of the Greater Fredericksburg Area, the following Amendment is hereby adopted and effective as of February 12, 2005 when it was approved at the monthly Gathering. The purpose of this amendment is to change the name of the community from "The Upper Room Emmaus of the Greater Fredericksburg Area" to "The Upper Room Emmaus of the Greater Fredericksburg Area, Inc."

Article I. Name: First paragraph is amended as follows:
