November 2006 Thoughts from the Lay Director...

Recently I was reading a book by my favorite author, Max Lucado called *Traveling Light*. In this book, he talks about the spiritual and emotional baggage we tend carry. If you're not into reading whole books he has condensed this into a 50 page booklet called "Give it all to Him". I highly recommend either one or both.

In his book he poses the question, "What if our spiritual baggage were visible, and tangible, what would it look like?" Would we see welldressed people carrying large trash bags over their shoulder, weighted down by their spiritual trash? Would some of us have bags that we could not even carry, but perhaps would need to drag along behind us?

What would we find in those bags? Would we find regrets, loneliness, worry, resentment? What would you be carrying; revenge, failure? What is it that is keeping you from serving God to your highest potential? Max says regrets seem to be the heaviest and most irritating of all. Do you allow regrets to stop you from doing things you need to?

The good news is that Jesus sees our burdens, and our trials and *He* bids you to bring them to Him. The Lord knows you are not meant to carry these things. So He is calling, come to me you who are heavy laden and give those burdens to me. Jesus really is the ultimate Sanitation Engineer. 1John 1:9 says if we will confess our sins and repent He is faithful to forgive us. Some call this the Christian's bar of soap. Leave your baggage at the foot of the cross, and let Jesus take it to His landfill. One of the problems is; we tend to go back and pick it up again. Let Him keep it.

I have teamed on a number of men's weekends and I am always amazed how burdened and weighed down these men are when they come in on Thursday evening. Most of them leave their baggage at the cross sometime during the weekend and they leave walking with a lighter step. Some will pick it up again but most will never pick it up again. God has chosen The Walk to Emmaus to be one instrument where both men and women can shed the baggage that is holding them prisoner. He uses this tool to help people go free to be better fathers, mothers, pastors, employers and employees. I meet people everyday at work or in the market place that are carrying heavy trash bags. Many of them are Christians, but they need a little help.

We must do everything we can to keep this great institution alive and viable and doing the work and will of God. Every day I see something new that tells me this is a worthwhile ministry. Just like any volunteer organization there are many different opinions and personalities at work in Emmaus. Let us make sure we keep a divine prospective. Let us put our own wants and desires and pride aside so that God can do His best work through this Community. Let's help people leave their baggage at that cross.

Someone once said that evangelism is just one beggar telling another beggar where to find bread. I think we could add to that, its one beggar telling another beggar where to leave their trash. Decolores.

Board News ...

The Board of Directors met at Tabernacle U.M.C. just prior to the gathering on October 14, 2006. There was a Quorum present.

We discussed dates for the walks in 2008 as there were some conflicts with Camp Happyland's schedule with the weekends chosen previously.

Also we briefly discussed the use of the new microphones during the men's walk and gathering later that evening. It was decided that it was a worthwhile investment. It was also reported that the equipment was purchased on sale, with extended warranties for less than originally quoted.

Most of the board's actions during this session consisted of putting "hands and feet" to the actions taken in previous meetings. It is a truth that it is easier to put a concept on paper that it is to make it work in reality.

Since the board is presenting the Day of Deeper Understanding in November, most of our time was devoted to the agenda of that gathering. We also briefly discussed some issues involving the training of Weekend Lay Directors, which was voted on last month.

We also discussed the need that we have someone certified in CPR present at every weekend walk. This is a requirement of Camp Happyland and probably a good idea for a number of reasons. However we have no such person on this up coming women's walk. Sandie Makely volunteered to get certified but asked that the community pay the associated expenses if there were any. It is possible that it could be done without cost. The board voted to cover the necessary expense if it arose.

We also discussed the need for childcare and possible solutions to that problem. It was presented that if we were to hire someone, or if we used volunteers we need to do a background check as required by most churches. It was suggested it would be nice if we could find people that have already been cleared by their churches. We really need a few good people to step up to this task.

Rick Dillard closed us with prayer.

On Behalf of the Board of Directors I would like to thank the Community for all of it's support that was given to the Men's walk FE-64. We had 250 candles for candlelight and nearly ran out, plus counting the ones people brought in. We also had a great turn out for closing and a lot of help cleaning up. THANK YOU!

Thank you Upper Room Emmaus of the Greater Fredericksburg Area Community for all of your love, support, prayers and service towards FE-64. The Men's walk was a wondrous and joy filled weekend for both the Pilgrims and Team. You sent us 24 inspired Pilgrims who came to Camp Happyland and helped transform both the Team and themselves over the 72 hours. And to top it off on Sunday evening, the Pilgrims gave wonderful testimonies with an inward reflection on their new priorities and a desire to walk closer with the Lord.
