Thoughts from the Community Lay Director...

As I am writing this, it is February, Fredericksburg Emmaus 70 is halfway through the teaming process and the Fredericksburg Emmaus 71 ladies have had their first team meeting. The theme for Fredericksburg Emmaus 71 is "My grace is sufficient for you" from Second Corinthians 12:9 And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." This is a great theme for an Emmaus walk as the primary purpose of Emmaus is to prepare us for a life lived in grace. The grace we receive cannot be purchased and it cannot be earned by us. It is a gift freely given.

This is also the way it is with the agape love and the new insight that you gain on an Emmaus walk. It is given to you as a free gift, generally you do not pay your sponsor back in anyway. In fact the only way that you can pay it back is by participating in the community as a volunteer, or sponsoring someone yourself. It is very much like a movie that came out a couple years ago called "Pay it Forward". The entire idea of the movie was to go and find someone to help that had no way that they could possibly pay you back. So the only way they could pay you back was to help someone else that could not pay them back, therefore paying it forward. According to the movie it caught on so well that the concept spread over many states and eventually came back to the young man who started it, and made a difference in the world in the process.

Now it is time for us to look around our churches and even neighboring churches that do not yet participate in the Emmaus community and for us to pay it forward by sponsoring someone new.

Many of us can relate to the apostle Paul in 2nd Corinthians. We may have a health issue or an emotional pain that we just feel we could function better if could get rid of this thing. But the Lord says, my grace is sufficient for you. When it comes time for you to minister his love and caring to someone, you can better understand their situation, because you have been there first. I see this time and again when listening to talks on an Emmaus team. The emotion and passion that comes from the speaker is born of experience and reaches out to the pilgrims and changes them forever.

Make sure that you support these upcoming walks in every way you can. Come to the gathering and send off the team, participate in candlelight and closing. They always need prayer, food and agape. If you feel called, pay it forward and sponsor someone too.

Attention all Volunteers

Hurry, we need you! There are immediate openings available for you to use your talents for the glory of God! The Fredericksburg Emmaus Community is once again looking for volunteers. Remember the colored placemats that were at your table each mealtime that so touched your hearts? Volunteers did that! Remember the telephone call that you received asking if you were ready for your walk? Volunteers did that, along with the registrations, the database for the community, and countless other endeavors. In fact, the lion share of the work accomplished in this community and that made your weekend happen and made it so special is accomplished by volunteers. Now we need your help to ensure that the same blessing you received is passed on to those who follow after you. Recently the Fredericksburg Emmaus Board has received word from a number of our volunteers who expressed a desire to be replaced in their current positions. Some of these volunteers have been serving the community faithfully for five years or more and feel that it is time to share the wealth with others in need of a blessing. We appreciate the hard work and faithful service of these who have toiled for so long.

We wish to commend these who have served faithfully for so long without complaint; however, we realize that volunteering for so long can lead to burn out and apathy. Therefore, the board is currently exploring the possibility of setting term limit's on volunteer positions. At the very least we believe that we should survey these volunteer positions on an annual basis. Additionally, due to the details involved in some of these volunteer positions, the board feels that it would be prudent to have current volunteers mentor their future replacements over a period of time. This would also ensure that we have someone capable of filling the gap if one of our current volunteers should become ill or move without notice.

Accordingly, if you are one of our current volunteers the board would like to hear from you. Specifically, the board would like to know if you are satisfied with your position and if you are willing to continue on in your current position.

Moreover, we would like for each of you—whether remaining in your position or not—to become intentional about training someone else to fill your position. Finally, if you are currently not serving the community we ask that you prayerfully consider filling one of our many volunteer positions and notify the board of your intentions.

The Next Generation: Being a Good Sponsor

The strength of any Emmaus community is a direct result of that community's recruiting practices. If the community is committed to recruiting strong church leaders for the purpose of strengthening the local church, then the community will be a strong, vital force in the renewal movement. If, on the other hand, the Walk to Emmaus is looked upon as a hospital where every human ill can be cured, it will have a weakened effect on the entire community. Emmaus is designed to spiritually renew church members who, in turn, can Christianize their environments. The church is a vital part of this renewal effort. If strong church members are recruited to attend Emmaus Walks, the Emmaus community will provide authentic spiritual renewal.

The overriding purpose of Emmaus is to Christianize environments such as home, business, friendships, and churches. As people have an opportunity to consider the reorientation of their priorities, to experience the grace of God in a loving community, to be wooed by the Holy Spirit to be disciples, and to participate in a supportive group following the weekend, it is only natural that they will want to change the most important things in their lives according to this new experience of love.

There are several qualities in a Pilgrim that this expectation would suggest. First, the prospective Pilgrim should already be on a pilgrimage, willing to grow and move forward in his or her journey of faith. Second, the person should have a Christian orientation—no, a Christian fervor. The Pilgrim knows God can make and has made a difference in life. Third, the prospective Pilgrim is not so consumed by other situations that he or she will not be able to give full attention to the message and experience of the Walk to Emmaus during the seventy-two-hour experience and all the follow-up activities.

Directions to Camp Happyland:

21457 Happyland Drive Richardsville, VA 22736

<u>From Central Park in Fburg</u>: Drive 7.5 miles west on Route 3. Turn right (North) on Route 610, Elys Ford Road. Drive 9 miles north on Route 610. Just prior to the green Richardsville sign, turn right (East) on Route 619, Richards Ferry Road. Drive 1.3 miles to Happyland Drive. You will see a large Camp Happyland sign on the right side of the road. Turn right into the Camp and proceed to the parking area. Total distance from Central Park is about 18 miles.

Directions to Lake of the Woods Church:

One Church Lane Locust Grove, VA 22508

The Lake of the Woods church is located approximately 15 miles west of Fredericksburg and 15 miles east of Culpeper off Route 3. Enter Lake of the Woods, (across from Burger King), and tell the guard at the gate you are attending LOW Church. Turn left inside the gate on Lakeview Parkway. Travel for 2.4 miles until you see the sign at Church Lane, then turn left.
