COMING SOON – HANOVER EPIPHANY #20

Greetings Fredericksburg Emmaus Community!

You may or may not be aware, but the next Hanover Epiphany adventure is about to begin! Hanover Epiphany #20 is underway and we are bubbling over with excitement and anticipation for how our loving God will work in the lives of those incarcerated youth. Our last adventure into the prison was filled with great joy at seeing so many accepting the Word and committing their lives to Christ. We are excited to serve and plant the seeds of faith and hope in the hearts of the young men God will send for this upcoming walk.

In Matthew 25, Jesus told us that as we feed, visit and clothe the hungry, needy, sick and those in prison we are doing for Him. I totally understand that not everyone can or is called to visit those in prison — I've always thought that wasn't for me! But there are so many ways you can be a vital part of this ministry without having to actually go into the prison, and you can touch the lives of these young men in a way that will blow them away! Here are 3 ways:

PRAYER: The most important way is to pray – and while I know that so many of you do every time you hear of upcoming Epiphany walks, I would ask you to go one step further and commit to praying for a half hour or hour at a specific time, just as we do for Emmaus walks. Usually we simply ask each of you to pray at some time during the weekend. For Hanover #20 as the Agape and Prayer Coordinator, I'm stepping out on faith believing that God will fill a Prayer Vigil for every ½ hour between midnight October 10th and midnight October 12th. Please either see me at the Gathering or e-mail me with your promise to pray during the weekend.

Each person who prays will be a "link" in a paper chain that is constructed to show visually to the boys how many people are praying for them. This is a mighty tool in helping these young men know just how much God loves them.

I believe that seeing some of those names assigned to a specific time will sink in even deeper with them – to know that "Joe" will pray for them in the middle of the night while they sleep – do you remember what that was like when you learned that amazing fact on your Emmaus walk? My e-mail is below.

AGAPE: Another amazing thing you can do is send agape – remember how that touched each of us on our walk? It does the boys as well. Please e-mail me for prison facility regulations, but prayerfully consider what you might do to bless these boys through cards or notes.

SPONSORSHIP: I realize in these tough times, this may be a VERY difficult request, but we have a form of Agape that is really powerful to these boys. Sponsoring a "Star" ("pilgrim" equivalent) for a lunch meal (\$5) or a dinner meal (\$10) or purchasing a bible for them (\$25) or sponsoring their entire weekend (\$50) is a tangible way that they understand immediately. We hand the boys a "bookmark" that says "Susie" paid for your lunch today or "Bill" bought this bible for you. They look at us in disbelief asking why someone would do that for them. They anxiously look around the room to find "Susie" and "Bill" thinking it must be someone who is teaming. When they learn that someone who doesn't even know them cared enough to feed them or give them God's word. they are moved in a way that can't be described. What a blessing you can be!!!

Thank you so much for reading this article – and I pray that you will support this ministry and "visit" these young men through prayer and any other way you may have time or opportunity to do! Thank you in advance for your participation with us in Hanover Epiphany #20!!

Directions to Camp Happyland:

21457 Happyland Drive Richardsville, VA 22736

From Central Park in Fburg: Drive 7.5 miles west on Route 3. Turn right (North) on Route 610, Elys Ford Road. Drive 9 miles north on Route 610. Just prior to the green Richardsville sign, turn right (East) on Route 619, Richards Ferry Road. Drive 1.3 miles to Happyland Drive. You will see a large Camp Happyland sign on the right side of the road. Turn right into the Camp and proceed to the parking area. Total distance from Central Park is about 18 miles.

Directions to Grace UMC Hartwood:

13056 Elk Ridge Rd Fredericksburg, VA 22406

From Fredericksburg: Take I-95 N to Exit 133 Rt 17 towards Warrenton. Continue for approximately 7 miles and turn right at Hartwood Rd/Rt 612. Take a slight right at Hartwood Rd and continue for 6 ½ miles then take a slight left at Poplar Rd. After 1 ½ miles, turn left at Elk Ridge Rd VA-614. Church will be on your right.
