### **Pilgrim/Team Support - Carol Burke**

What is Progressive Servanthood? According to the Upper Room Handbook of Emmaus: The purpose of an established progression of responsibilities for Emmaus community members is two fold: leadership training and spiritual development. A person's readiness to carry out his or her particular assignment effectively often depends on and is always enhanced by prior experience in another position. The progression of responsibilities starts with support roles (agape, kitchen, set-up) and then moves into the talk room. Entry positions for The Talk Room Team are either Assistant Table Leader or Table Leader. Experience in both positions is necessary before progressing to Assistant Lay Director. The position of Weekend Lay Director is for those who have served at least twice as an Assistant Lay Director.

### **Manuals Support - Mike Remington:**

### Weekend Support - Mike McDonald:

As we near the start of FE-82 the Servant Team has completed training and is ready to provide back room support to the Pilgrims and Men's Talk Room Team of FE-82.

The Servant Team for FE-83 has also began their training and are doing very well in their preparations to serve the Pilgrims and Talk Room Team of FE-83.

We have a couple of open positions in the community servant areas that will need to be filled and addressed before the fall walks. We need a new Trailer Coordinator, hopefully before the end of FE-83 so that the trailer can be taken from Camp Happyland to a new storage location. The current location will no longer be able to be used after the end of May at the conclusion of FE-83.

We are also in need of a Community Agape Coordinator. This is the person that contacts other communities to send our "Wall Agape" and to request Agape from other communities. These are the letters etc that are typically in the book shown to the pilgrims when Agape is presented. Monica Warne has been doing this for us for several years and actually has this very well organized. I have taken this responsibility for the spring walks but will not be able to continue the duties going into the fall. Therefore we need a volunteer as soon as possible.

Please see me if you are led to either of these positions or have questions regarding either position.

## Reports from your Board Members/Coordinators (continued):

### **Upper Room Guidelines Implementation Committee - Dawn Kendall**

Last summer, the Board of the Directors created a Guidelines Implementation Committee and tasked it with reviewing the Upper Room Emmaus model. The committee has spent months reading, discussing, and praying over the Handbook and accompanying manuals, identified areas where the Fredericksburg community had moved away from the model and made recommendations for how our community could align with the model while maintaining our traditions.

The weekend activities are not significantly changed. Much of the changes involve our behind the scenes processes—how teams are selected, how roles and responsibilities break out, HOW we do things, rather than WHAT we do.

The purpose of Emmaus is to renew the church as the body of the risen Christ in the world. This is accomplished through the Emmaus walk, group reunions, Gatherings, sponsorship, support of other communities, and service on teams. The Fredericksburg community is encouraged to put more attention into other facets of the mission and be less walk-centric.

The theme of the walk is Luke 24:13-35. This is the story of the Walk to Emmaus. Verses from this story may be used during the walk. "DeColores" is the walk song. There are no secondary themes, verses, or songs.

Progressive servanthood is the path for both leadership training and spiritual development. The progression of responsibilities starts with support roles and then moves into the talk room. Emmaus leadership begins and ends with anonymous positions of servanthood. Sacrifice and servanthood are the heart of Emmaus.

The Talk Room team and Servant team have been separated. Team meetings involve only the talk room team. Although servants are critical to the success of the weekend, their focus is different than that of the talk room team. The needs of both teams are better met through separate team meetings.

An Orientation meeting will be conducted prior to all walks. It includes all conference room team members and servant team members. The Orientation is conducted by Board members not serving on the associated walk. Topics of the meeting include: talk room team responsibilities, servant team responsibilities, team formation plan (teaming information), and an overview of the walk.

Team members should not sponsor pilgrims on walks they are serving. Sponsorship has specific responsibilities, both to the pilgrim on the walk and to the pilgrim's family at home. Serving as a sponsor is a form of agape. Team members cannot adequately fulfill their team roles and sponsorship roles on the weekend.

A master schedule had been created. The schedule aligns with the model wherever possible and defers to the Fredericksburg community traditions when there is discrepancy. After each talk, there is distinct time for meditation, discussion, and creative response. At the end of each day, the team meeting follows a basic agenda: table family review, next day agenda, team assignments, and prayer. This schedule will be reviewed after the Spring 2011 walks to identify any issues.

Church diversity should be represented among table leaders and assistant table leaders, and leadership. There should be no more pilgrims from any one church than tables; pilgrims should not be from the same church as the table leader or assistant table leader.

The Weekend Lay Director and Weekend Spiritual Director are selected by the Board of Directors.

The WLD and the 4th Day speaker (by tradition, the next WLD) must be in a reunion group in order to provide an honest testimony.

Servants have the option of staying onsite or traveling each day to Camp Happyland but must honor their weekend commitment. Costs are based on the decision to stay or travel.

Servants work where needed, not in specific roles. Support service (outside of the talk room) should be anonymous, humble, and selfless. Servants do not receive agape. Community volunteers also work where needed.

The team roster is: 1 WLD, 3 ALDs, 1 table leader per table, 1 assistant table leader per table, 1 WSD, 4 ASDs, 1 music Director, 1 Assistant Music Director, 1 Board Rep, and 1 floater. An additional musician may be added. On a 5-table walk with a fully expanded team, there would be 24 team members.

The team is encouraged to create a leadership table in a manner consistent with the other tables in the talk room. This models behavior for the pilgrims and removes the feeling that the pilgrims are being watched from the back of the room. All team members not assigned to tables should sit at the leadership table.

Musicians should give their full attention to talk room activities. There should be no business conducted inside the talk room. The music team should have all of their materials prepared and queued prior to the music session.

The only computer in the talk room should be the one used to show PowerPoint talk slides and music lyrics.

All speakers must preview their talks. The only preassigned talks are: Priorities (experienced ALD), 4th Day (experienced ALD), Perseverance (WLD), and Means of Grace (WSD).

Team members should be low key about their team status and participation in Emmaus. No clothing or personal items marked with other weekend information should be taken into the talk room (shirts, hats, tote bags, walk buttons, etc).

### **Upper Room Guidelines Implementation Committee -continued...**

Crosses are not worn during the weekend. The team may wear their crosses after the pilgrims have received theirs. Community members should not wear their crosses during weekend activities other than Closing. WLDs may provide simple ways to identify pilgrims during the walk.

The prayer chapel is a holy place set apart specifically for prayer. Community members and servants are encouraged to visit the prayer chapel throughout the weekend.

Each team is encouraged to establish a Community Room for servants and community volunteers. The dining hall, front porch, and prayer chapel are not places to socialize. When not engaged in service, the Community Room provides a place to sit during breaks.

There are no handouts before, during, or after the talks. This removes any copyright issues and removes the possibility of speakers guiding the talk away from the intended message. PowerPoint slides may be used during the talk.

There is no music until Friday morning before the Prevenient Grace talk.

The Music team explains the various types of music used during the weekend (praise, prayer, meal blessing, and worship). The Music team will teach the pilgrims "DeColores" and "Jesus Jesus." The "Joy Flag" song is an acceptable song choice during music time, but it is not a scheduled event.

The movie "In Remembrance" has been replaced by an 8 minute DVD. The DVD is accompanied by updated WLD and WSD remarks.

On Friday morning, pilgrims may sit anywhere they choose at breakfast. The WLD leads the blessing. There are no place cards or table invitations set out.

Table invitations are done by roll call. This allows the pilgrims to once again associate a name with a face, to hear the names of the other tables, and to see where their roommates and friends are seated.

Prayer partners come from the Servant team and the community. Talk Room team members remain in the talk room. Presentation of talk summaries are shared by the pilgrims on Friday and Saturday nights.

Readings have been removed from the schedule due to copyright issues ("Lord I Have Time," "Please Hear What I Am Not Saying," "Who Me?")

Means of Grace talk includes handing out index cards and instructions to write general questions about means of grace to be answered by SDs. ALL SDs meet to decide which questions will be answered and how those questions will be answered. Q&A session is no more than 15 minutes.

Dying Moments uses two loaves of bread. The first loaf is used to represent our sin and it is left at the foot of the cross. The second loaf is used for Communion. The meditation and liturgy are provided by the Upper Room. Naming of the sins (public confession) is part of the service.

After lunch on Saturday, there is a long break. The team is encouraged to leave the break intact for the pilgrims.

At Candlelight, the pilgrims sing "Jesus Jesus" to the Community twice, then depart for chapel.

Fellowship time on Saturday night lasts a reasonable but limited time after the last pilgrim has left the chapel; everyone is encouraged to be in bed by midnight (team and pilgrims)

Personal agape is an expression of unconditional love and should be anonymous. Agape from reunion groups and churches may be signed as such.

On Sunday, pilgrims will be given identified bags to collect their personal belongings before the talk room is broken down for the cross ceremony.

After the cross ceremony, the pilgrims and talk room team have a time of song and prayer before going to Closing.
