From the Community Spiritual Director

Hello from your Community Spiritual Director. Once again I want to state that I am here to serve the community to the best of my ability and each of you are the community. If anyone has a need or a problem please do not hesitate to contact me. I can be reached through North Stafford Baptist Church.

I wanted to write to you this month about something that is critical to our existence as people of God. A little thing that we call "faith" (Hebrews 11:6). The Scriptures say that without faith it is impossible to please God. We are also told that with faith the size of a grain of mustard seed we can command mountains to move and they will obey. Yet many Christians in our world today and even many among us remain mired in depression, doubt, and fear. We are not living victoriously for God, or experiencing breakthrough because we are not living lives of faith. So what is the problem? We believe in God, we have been washed by the blood by grace – through faith, so why are we continually defeated and live in fear of our finances, our health, or any number of other things we count as important in this life?

I believe the answer can be found in a close examination of Hebrews 11. We look at the patriarchs and heroes of the faith in Scripture and many of us think, "Oh if only I could have their faith, if only I could be like them, I wouldn't struggle through the problems I have." We tend to set these men and women up on pedestals simply because they are written about in the Bible. Yet as we examine each of them we find that they were ordinary folks beset by ordinary temptation and sin. Noah, after being used by God to save humanity, shortly after coming off the Ark, was found drunk and naked in his tent. Abraham lied about his relationship with Sarah because he was afraid for his life. Then his son Isaac did the same thing with Rebekah. David, a man after God's own heart, was an adulterer and murderer. Each of these Bible heroes were men and women just like you and me.

You see, there was nothing in them that made them great. They did none of the things that they did under their own power or will. Rather, they were ordinary men and women being directed and used by an extraordinary God to accomplish His purposes. You do not have to be extraordinary to do extraordinary things, you simply have to trust God and follow Him unconditionally wherever He leads.
