From the Community Spiritual Director

Grace is a topic that never ceases to amaze me. Many of you have probably heard before the definition of grace and the difference between grace and mercy. Grace is defined as God's unmerited favor. Mercy is not getting something that we deserve, (in this case God's just punishment), and grace is getting something that we don't deserve, (Eternal Life). I stand in constant awe in the presence of God's grace for me. That God would forgive me, and forgive me, and forgive me. That despite my inability to walk in perfection and to keep perfectly God's will, God knows my weaknesses and forgives me.

But what I have been really meditating on lately is our need to give grace to one another. The Bible tells us that we are to imitate the life of Christ in our own lives and therefore, there is a requirement for us to deal with one another with mercy and grace. One of the greatest examples of this demonstrated for this in Scripture is the encounter between Christ and the woman at the well.

This woman was a Samaritan – by the mere fact of her heritage this was someone who Jesus should have spurned and avoided at all costs. Samaritans were considered the dregs of society by the Jews. Further, this was a woman who had engaged in multiple sexual encounters with men who were not her husband and who knows what other countless sins. Conversely, Jesus was the very virtue of holiness. The Bible says that he was tempted in all ways the same as you and I, yet was without sin. If there was anyone who had the right to condemn this woman, to hold her accountable by bluntly pointing out her sins, it was Christ. Yet His interaction with her was one of compassion. He spoke with her gently, and while He did not allow her to continue in her sinfulness this was not the primary subject of His encounter with her. Christ was not as concerned with what she had done, but rather with what she would do in the future.

Similarly, with the woman caught in adultery Christ's comment to the woman was "neither do I condemn you, go and sin no more." Isn't it refreshing to know that Christ does not keep a list of our failures and beat us over the head with THEM?

In the same way, let us deal with one another, dealing with one another in love and compassion, seeking to restore the brother or sister who has failed with grace and mercy.

After all, we are all sinners who have been saved by God's grace.

My Fourth Day...So Far

It has been just over three years since my Walk (FE 75). God gave me my "marching orders" at dying moments that weekend – a very clear directive to do a specific thing. Along with my husband, Richard, I was to develop a three-day experience similar to Emmaus, (but not for people who are already in the church), similar to Epiphany, (but not for people who are behind bars), and similar to the Alpha Course, (a short course in Christianity). Thus was born HOPE3. HOPE stands for He Opens People's Eyes and our ministries have blossomed in ways we couldn't have conceived of even a year ago. We have built an addition on our home that houses a weekly fellowship called Risen Hope and we continue to work on creating the HOPE3 Weekend. The project is overwhelming, but God keeps reminding me that with Him, all things are possible!

SPIRITUAL DIRECTORS:

Nancy McDaniel: Currently Senior Pastor at Rhoadsville Baptist Church. Walked in Southwest Virginia Emmaus in 1996 and has teamed every year except two since that time. Have given 4 of the Emmaus grace talks, some repeatedly.

Gayle Porias: Currently Pastor at Mount Horeb UMC, Catlett, VA. Holds a Master of Divinity from Wesley Theological Seminary. Walked on National Capital Walk to Emmaus E-109 May 2003. Served on 9 Kairos teams and 1 Emmaus team. Have given 6 lay talks and 2 clergy talks.

Two Teams, One Walk

There are two teams serving on every Emmaus walk: a talk room team and a servant team. Each team has specific duties during the Emmaus walk weekend and each team has separate training to help them prepare. According to the Upper Room Emmaus model, the ONLY time these two teams are together is during the Orientation, which serves as the first meeting for both groups.

Talk Room Team. The Talk Room team deals directly with the pilgrims during the Emmaus Walk weekend. The team composition is specifically presented by the Upper Room. There is 1 Weekend Lay Director, 3 Assistant Lay Directors, a table leader and an assistant table leader for each table, 2 musicians with an optional third to grow the ministry, and 5 Spiritual Directors. Our Board of Directors has added a floater to the team to fill in as needed during the weekend. The team meets for months prior to the walk to receive talk training and table training, and to learn how to present the information to the pilgrims in a safe environment. During the weekend, the Talk Room team is the face of Emmaus, directly interacting with the pilgrims. These team members are often the people the pilgrims will seek as they join the community and attend Gatherings.

Servant Team. According to the Upper Room's Emmaus Handbook, the Emmaus Walk weekend servant roles are filled by community volunteers. Because our community has the blessing of Camp Happyland, we do not need the

types of servants described in the handbook, (such as kitchen staff). However, the distance to Camp Happyland and the camp's isolation creates a unique situation for our community. In an effort to make serving during the weekend easier, the Board of Directors, with the approval of the Upper Room, created a specific Servant team that may stay at the camp during the weekend. The Servant team manages all the logistical work of the weekend so that the Talk Room team may focus on the pilgrims. The Servant Team works behind the scenes to set up for activities, prepare pilgrim agape, and ensure that prayer partners are coordinated. The team training includes reviewing the details of the weekend schedule, agape set up, and prayer chapel coordination. The team ensures that prayer partners are established and the prayer vigil is filled. The Servant team sees that the activities of the weekend go off without a hitch.

Because the functions of the two teams are so different, they do not meet together during the training time. The Servant Team serves humbly and without recognition, as the hands and feet of Jesus. The Talk Room team leads the program as the faces of Emmaus. By ensuring that everything is ready and at hand, the Servant team enables the Talk Room team to focus on the pilgrims. The weekend cannot succeed without the attention and work of BOTH of these teams.
