From the Community Lay Director

A few weekends ago my church assisted a mission team going to Cambodia by building 91 bunk beds that will be assembled in some orphanages there. We started with stacks of lumber that were delivered on Saturday and about 15 of us got things set up and cut the lumber to length. On Sunday, we had over 100 people show up to do the major part of the work – drilling, routing, sanding and getting the completed bunk beds into a shipping container.

It was great to see the body of Christ come together to make the bunk beds a reality. We had kids carrying boards from station to station. People running sanders and getting covered in dust. There were routers and drills running for hours straight. People were aiding those running power tools by bringing wood to them and taking the finished wood from them. It was an amazing sight to see the parking lot full of people (and sawdust).

The weekend reminds me – although without the sawdust – of an Emmaus weekend. There is a small group of people that do the preparation for the weekend. I am, of course, talking about the team. They prepare the way for the big work that is to come which is the weekend.

And just like the bunk bed project, a larger group of people come together over the weekend

to assemble the parts needed for the weekend. Pilgrims need to be brought to the weekend. Agape needs to be made and delivered. Prayers need to be prayed. Speakers give their talks. Beds need to be made. Meals need to be served. Rooms get set up with tables and chairs. Candles need to be lit. And everything needs to get put away. The body of Christ comes together to make the weekend a reality.

If you are looking to be involved in the upcoming weekend, we still need people. We have slots on the prayer vigil that need filling. Some speakers still need people to come pray for them at Camp Happyland. We need people to sign up to come be community servants for the weekend (especially Friday and Sunday). We need you to come light a candle on Saturday night. Please email me (respond to the newsletter email) and I will get you in touch with the right person.

From the Community Spiritual Director

I borrowed portions of the following from a devotional that I read this week that really struck me about something that has been on my mind a lot lately about the Church today. I struggle with the idea of Sunday morning Christians. Those who are pious on Sunday and worldly the rest of the week. It seems to me that when the Church becomes like the world, when you cannot tell the professing Christian apart from the unsaved beside them, then one of them ceases to be relevant. Christ expected the Church to impact the world by being peculiar from it. There is to be a differentness about the believer that immediately identifies them without their needing to declare their identity.

The believer who is living effectively for Christ does not need to shout "I am a Christian" because their lives, their deeds, their words are shouting it for them. If we desire people to desire our Christ do we not need to demonstrate by our lives the difference that He has made in us? Otherwise, why bother. So, it is in that vein that I share with you the following:

"God did extraordinary miracles through Paul, so that even handkerchiefs and aprons that had touched him were taken to the sick, and their illnesses were cured and the evil spirits left them" (Acts 19:11-12).

There is an expression that we use today to indicate the genuineness of someone: "He's the real deal." The idea that we are expressing is that the person of whom we are speaking is really who they are appearing to be. They are not putting on an act, not trying to be someone whom they are not, not trying to convince you or I that they are something that they are not. It is an assertion that the person is the same when no one is watching as they are when the whole world is watching. They are not putting on airs so to speak. To me it is a compliment when someone says "You are the real deal." It means you are not a hypocrite or trying to be someone you are not.

The apostle Paul was the real deal. God began using Paul in amazing ways as recorded in the book of Acts. When God began to use Paul in such amazing ways there arose people who saw this power who also wanted to do the same acts as Paul. The problem was they were not the real deal. They were trying to be someone they were not. They were trying to appropriate the same Power Source as Paul without ever having a relationship with the Power Source. It nearly killed them.

"Some Jews who went around driving out evil spirits tried to invoke the name of the Lord Jesus over those who

were demon-possessed. They would say, 'In the name of Jesus, whom Paul preaches, I command you to come out.' Seven sons of Sceva, a Jewish chief priest, were doing this. [One day] the evil spirit answered them, 'Jesus I know, and I know about Paul, but who are you?' Then the man who had the evil spirit jumped on them and overpowered them all. He gave them such a beating that they ran out of the house naked and bleeding" (Acts 19:13-16).

There are great numbers in the Church today who are putting on an act. As the Scriptures put it "...they have a form of godliness but are denying the power thereof..." God is not interested in our hollow professions, or our works of righteousness. He doesn't care if you say you are a Christian, He wants you to be a Christian.

There is an undeniable power in the Gospel of Christ. It is an overwhelming power that overtakes the life of one who has placed their trust in Christ. It is a power that begins to change the genuine believer from the inside out. The Christian begins to think differently, then to talk differently, then to walk differently until they become genuinely peculiar people from those in the world.

Jesus said to His disciples that the world would hate them, just as they had hated Christ. Why, because of the power that was in them. Because in the walk of a genuine believer there is a quality of life that confronts the unsaved with their lostness. They don't like that feeling, they want to feel good about themselves in the midst of their sin and so they hate and persecute the believers.

The demons were not fooled by the Seven sons of Sceva. They lacked the power in their lives that comes with the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. And they are not fooled by any of us who are walking in our own power apart from the Holy Spirit. Friends, it is impossible to be the real deal without tapping into the real Power Source. The Holy Spirit is our Power Source.

So, I ask you once again to consider your lives. Consider the testimony of your walk. Is there a genuineness and power about your Christian walk? If you were in a lineup with unbelievers would someone be able to pick you out of the crowd? Have you surrendered to the power of the Holy Spirit in your life? I believe that we are drawing perilously close to the end time, to the coming of our Lord and Savior to gather in His Church.

Therefore, I also believe that it is time to stop playing church and start being the Church. Not denying the power of God, but living in its fullness.
