Thoughts from the Community Lay Director

Happy February!

February is a peek at Spring with Ground Hog day, will it be 6 more weeks of Winter, or the start of Spring early? February is Valentine's Day, new loves, old loves, rejuvenation of your love of so many years.

February is patriotic, with Presidents Day and Flag Day, we celebrate our past and our heritage.

For our Emmaus community, February, this year is also the time for Spring Walks. The men's walk is the last weekend of the month, and the women's walk is the very next weekend. We have 7 pilgrims total. The rule used to be that all applications had to be in 3 weeks before the date of the Walk. For some time now, we have not adhered to that rule, because we want to hold the walks and not cancel.

So this February I am in a predicament, do I cancel the walks? Do I hold out and pray that we receive more applications? Receiving them this late can make things harder on the Sponsor, gathering the personal agape, making all the necessary arrangements...

Both teams have been meeting and are so ready for the weekend, so many prayers have gone into all of the decisions, but now what?

Do you have an application that you have not sent in? Do you know someone that would benefit from going on the Walk to Emmaus? There isn't much time. We need to let the camp know how many we are sending, and our community cannot afford to pay for a weekend that does not have enough pilgrims.

Just so the community knows how this works — we are charged for the team and a minimum of 17 pilgrims. If we do not have 17 pilgrims we still have to pay for them. We have to give the final count to Camp Happyland 2 weeks before the start of the Walk, so for the men, that means we need to give them the count on Feb. 13th. For the women we need to give them the count on Feb. 20th.

As of this writing we have 3 applications for men, and 4 for women.

If you have an application, get it sent in and also, please email all the information to Tom or Bonnie Wells, rogue_usmc_ret@yahoo.com, bonnie_wells@hotmail.com, and to Debbie Bliss dhbliss@cox.net.

There are underscores in the spaces, which you might not be able to see on both of the Wells' email addresses.

On the 12th and 19th, we will be making the decision of whether to cancel these walks.

Please keep these Spring walks in your prayers, and please send in any applications that you may have.

Time is short, and we are praying that some have just not realized how close we are to the Walk dates.

GOD'S LOVE LETTER

My husband Joe was a man of few words. The few words he shared were thoughtful, loving and wise. We had only three years together as husband and wife as well as a 17 month courtship. We shared only four Valentine's Days together. Our first dates were attending each other's church Valentine Banquets! He was in the hospital on our first Valentine's Day as a married couple, and he gave me a pretty card which he had bought earlier and hidden. He requested that I find it and bring it to him at the hospital. He truly was feeling too bad even to sign it, but he did with the words: More later. Love, Joe.

When I went on my Emmaus Walk in 1996, I did not receive an agape letter from my husband. I really thought little about it, since the other letters overwhelmed me. When I returned from my walk, my husband presented me with a lovely handwritten letter (front and back) on beautiful stationery featuring a single red rose. He explained that I didn't receive it on the walk because he just needed more time to get his thoughts together and say what he really wanted to say. That agape letter was a love letter from my husband—the only one he would ever write to me. He wrote words of love and devotion and of thanksgiving to God for my being his wife. He wrote of my calling and my ministry and the pride that he felt in knowing that his wife was answering God's call. Eighteen years later, I read that letter often. I will cherish it for as long as I live. I can hear Joe's voice as I read it. I can feel his love. That letter is among my most cherished possessions.

We are blessed to have God's love letter to us in the gift of His Son:

Fourth Day Testimony

I was born and raised in church and I thought just b/c I called myself a Christian and went to church I knew who God was! However, it was during my teenage years and into my young adult life that I began to fall upon the ways of the world and realized I didn't know God at all. In fact, I had fallen so far away from him b/c of my own actions. In addition, I was destroying all of my relationships and everything that I was acting out and doing landed me behind prison bars. Trust me, Prison was not the place I wanted to be, but it was the best thing that ever happened to me. I found God and realized that when he was all I had, He was enough....For the first time, I really had a relationship that wasn't conditional. I never will forget that w/in those prison walls was where I first heard about Kairos and then later found out that it was very similar to Emmaus.

When I did my walk, in November of 2010 I had only been out of prison 10 months. On FE-81 I was a pilgrim, and didn't even know the sweet lady that sponsored me at the time. I just knew that I was so ready for a change and I could not return to the same things that the past had offered me. Well, when I went on that weekend I thought maybe just maybe I would share a little bit about myself and go home & Sheeze was I in for a surprise when God revealed to me something more! Since then, I took what I learned and took it back to the church I attended and God started doing his "MAGIC". I was ordained as a Deacon in that church despite the feelings of being so unworthy, as well as truly being able to live out my testimony instead of just talking about it. I have served on the servant team and just recently served

on the Women's FE-92 walk were I was able to be in the talk room for the first time. I guess you can say I am a true "Emmaus Groupie" and have caught the BUG, b/c each time since, I walk away w/ such a God & Jesus High!!!

This past teaming experience to me meant trusting in God in a new way as well as refresh my memory as to who Christ has called me to be. I needed a subtle reminder apparently, that "Every Moment Counts, and you get out of relationships what you put into them" (not only w/ God, but also w/ people). I also needed reminding that I need a healthy balance in my life, and if my "Priorities" are out of line, then I am running a rats race and am getting no where and that life was sometimes meaningless. Not to mention, that God had moved out of 1st place and that all my listening was not beginning and ending w/ Him. Since my 4th day, so much has happened and I could never begin to express or fathom why other than the explanation of what an "AMAZING or AWESOME" God I serve. I realized that through this all, the more I study, the more I want! So now, I am going one step further and finally going back to school to pursue that.

Never would I have ever imagined that when I said "Lord Send Me" he truly would....I came to bless the pilgrims and be a servant, but b/c I did so and stayed humble....in the process God did all of these very same things to me and then some!!
