# From the CSD

#### A SACRIFICE FOR THE SAVIOR

The Season of Lent begins on Wednesday, March 5, which is Ash Wednesday and continues until Easter. Lent is a period of 40 days of preparation for Resurrection Day—Easter. If you count the days between Ash Wednesday and Easter, there are a few more than 40; Sundays are not counted, for they are always the celebration of resurrection. It is a time for Christians to prepare for some of the most important events in Jesus' ministry—what Jesus did for us on Good Friday and Easter Sunday, what He did for us on Golgotha's cross and at the empty tomb. It has been called "a kind of Christian spring training and spring cleaning." Some people "give up" something for Lent—fasting from something that I truly love to eat or do. I have done this for many decades, and every time I miss what I am sacrificing for these 40 days, I remember the great sacrifice that Jesus made for me. My small sacrifice amazingly leads me to think about Christ's sacrifice for me.

These words of the prophet Isaiah speak of the full extent of our sacrifice as those who have chosen to follow Christ.

"Is this the kind of fast I have chosen, only a day for one to humble himself? Is it only for bowing one's head like a reed and for lying in sackcloth and ashes? Is that what you call a fast, a day acceptable to God? Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to loose the chains of injustice and untie the cord of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke? Is it not to share your food with the hungry and to provide the poor wanderer with shelter—when you see the naked, to clothe him, and not to turn away from your own flesh and blood?" Isaiah 58:5-7

And then these words of Isaiah, read by Jesus in the Temple about Himself, speak of His mission and ours as we are called to sacrifice ourselves for others.

"The spirit of the Lord is upon me because the Lord has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and the day of vengeance of our God. To comfort all who mourn, and provide for those who grieve in Zion—to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting for the Lord for the display of his splendor." Isaiah 61:1-3

During this Lenten season, may we sacrifice ourselves to the Lord and His people as we look for the needs of others and seek to meet those needs in Jesus' name. And if we cannot DO something for those in need or GO to them, then let us PRAY that the Lord will send someone to be Christ to them. Truly this could be our dearest sacrifice for Lent and good preparation for Resurrection!
