Thoughts from the Community Lay Director

Community,

During our Board Meeting last month, we went over the financial wellness of the Fredericksburg Emmaus Community. We have been losing money on the last few walks and know that we as a community cannot continue on as we are going.

Here is what we discussed. If we stay as we are, we will be able to hopefully continue for 2 more years and then we will have to dissolve due to lack of funds.

God asks us to be good stewards, and we cannot go on as we are, and fulfill that obligation justly.

With only having 12 - 16 pilgrims per walk, we are not making enough to cover the walks, and the community is paying the difference.

Things that we have done is increase the number of members on the servant team, pushing for up to 8 on the servant team, makes less work for each servant, plus adds money to the income of each walk, while not taking anything away, since we pay for the use of all of Building A, and there are plenty of beds for the team and servants, as well as the clergy.

We must have enough pilgrims and community signed up three weeks before a walk to cover the cost of the walk. If we do not, we may have to postpone or cancel a walk assuming we can get out of our contract with Camp Happyland. We will take pilgrim applications up to 10 days before a walk.

On the men's walk FE - 93, the clergy elected to also sleep in Building A, which saved us having to rent the rooms in the Guest Lodge, a saving of over \$600. Bless these men for being willing to be true servants and use the wonderful accommodations in Building A.

While a good thing about only having 16 or less Pilgrims is we only need to rent the Inn and not the Guest Lodge too, it is still not enough to break even or to be able to put money back for supplies, materials and other things needed by the community to hold 4 walks per year.

So here are the things the board came up with and voted unanimously on after much discussion and prayer:

Continue with more servants on each team. Enforce the cutoff date for applications, if we do not have enough Pilgrims we cancel or postpone.

All clergy of the same sex as the team will use Building A, if there are clergy of the opposite sex on a team, we will rent one room only, that has twin beds to be shared by the two clergy.

We are raising the teaming and Pilgrim fees to \$220. Please do not let that stop you from teaming or from sponsoring.

There are many ways we can make up the difference, have a group or your church help with sponsoring, or ask for a partial scholarship. If God has called you to be on a team or to sponsor a Pilgrim, He will also show you the way to afford it.

Our fees have not been raised in over 5 years, while the amount we pay to Camp Happyland has gone up. We looked to see if there are other places available, and could not find anything in the area that would work and that was priced lower then what we are paying now.

We as a board prayed about these decisions for a month before coming together and deciding how to go forward. We all agree that being good Stewards of your money is our greatest obligation and do not want to see an end come to this community.

We will continue to pray and are looking forward to the day when we are financially stable again. We ask that you join us in that prayer.
