## **AUGUST BOARD NOTES**

The Board meeting opened with a devotion by Pastor Chris, who spoke from Ephesians 4:11, each of us doing our own part, using our gifts, as we are called by God.

Purpose of the Upper Room: The purpose of Emmaus is to renew the church as the body of the risen Christ in the world through the renewal of Christians as faithful and committed Disciples of Christ.

Purpose of the Fredericksburg Community (per bylaws): The purpose of Fredericksburg Emmaus shall be to inspire, challenge, and equip church members for Christian action, in their homes, churches, places of work, and the world community through the Emmaus experience.

The Board discussed the proposed Community Action Event/service project for Camp Happyland this fall in honor of Walks 99 and 100. Also discussed was the 25th Anniversary of Fredericksburg Emmaus next October 2016 and asked for input for how to celebrate this with the community, with the idea of having surrounding communities join us.

Now that Emmaus is getting more "tech savvy" in communicating with the Fredericksburg Emmaus Community, a question arose about how we communicate with people in the community who have no access to the internet. Do we want to mail paper newsletters? How do we determine the list of those who need paper copies? We must consider the expense of doing this. Another option is to send 25 hard copies to area churches (300) where people have Walked. Again, expensive. An email with the newsletter attached could be sent to area churches with the request that a copy be printed out and posted in the church building. A post meeting suggestion: ask our churches to include the www.fredwalk.org link on their church website.

Gary Adkins, the community button/badge maker, noted some months ago that the community button maker was wearing out and requested a new one be purchased. The Board voted to replace the worn out machine with a new model that uses the same supplies as the old one.

Terry Cook, Community Lay Director, and the Board set a date to meet to review the community by-laws, from 6:00-8:00 p.m. following the September 12 Gathering.

Items on the agenda had to be tabled until the next meeting due to lengthy discussions. We closed with prayer at 3:48.

## FROM THE COMMUNITY SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

Well, we have begun preparation for another set of Walks for the Fredericksburg Emmaus Community - Walks FE-99 and FE-100 - our "Centennial Walks". This is guite a landmark for us all, and a time to look back over where we have been, where we are, and where God will lead us in the future. As many of us realize, especially those of us who have been a part of the Community for a long time, many things have changed over the 24 years of our existence. Where we conduct our walks, how we choose our teams, how we actually conduct the walk and the training leading up to each walk - all of these have changed in one way or another. Many of us have opinions, concerns and appreciation for the changes that have become a part of who we are today.

Traditions and patterns of behavior are comforting and often make us feel secure or confident in what we are doing. If we allow our traditions to shape who we will be and have them provide a basis from which we move forward, then we are wise in our use of them. If we anchor ourselves to them, we allow them to lead us instead of God. If we begin to feel that the traditions we have developed and become comfortable with are so important that we begin to center our ways of doing things around them, we have become the Pharisees we see in Scripture who often opposed Jesus.

We need to remember that the Pharisees were trying to do what they thought would make them more holy and more worthy in the eyes of God. The problem was, they became more enamored of the "ways" they did things and less focused on the "whys". In Mark's Gospel (chapter 7) Jesus quotes the Prophet Isaiah to the Pharisees noting, "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines." Jesus represented and still represents change in our world and reminds us that even the best of intentions can lead us astray.

We always need to remember that what is important is that God will use us in the ways that will lead to what is best for all his people. We need to have faith that when we trust the Holy Spirit to lead us, even if we are being led through changes in our traditions, that we will be doing the work God wants done.

We in Emmaus are called to focus on the Pilgrims God is sending to us and in continuing our growth as Disciples of Jesus Christ, not on our feeling "comfortable" in the tools God uses to accomplish that work. Yes, change is hard, and yes, not all change is good. We need to challenge changes that do not contribute to our mission of creating Disciples, but we need to do it in a loving and Christian way. Let us be willing to judge the value of the changes in our traditions by the ways they accomplish God's work in the Pilgrims and in our own lives, not by how "warm and fuzzy" they make us feel personally.

Growth requires change, and for us to be an effective community for doing God's work, we must grow and serve others in new and exciting ways. Let us move forward together, standing on the foundation our history and traditions provide, but building and growing from that foundation - not become chained to it. As we move forward into our "Centennial" walks and look forward to our 25th year as a Community, let us also look forward to the new ways in which God will use us to do his work in the world. ## WALK FEES AND DUE DATES

**Application Fee \$25** – Due when you submit the completed application. If this fee is not included with the application the application will not be counted as valid until fee is received.

**Sponsorship Fee \$220** – Due, (not mailed, but in the Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is not acceptable to bring the Sponsorship Fee on the night the Walk starts.

A check must be written to Camp Happyland the morning of the Walk and is deposited the next day. Therefore, for Emmaus to be good stewards and to be in line with strong business practices, you must send your fees in a minimum of one week before the walk. This fee is tax-deductible, (because you personally are not receiving anything tangible in return). You will be sent a letter, showing your donation, in January of the following year.

**Team Fee - \$220** – Due, (not mailed, but in Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is preferable that this is given to the Board Rep, for your Walk, during teaming.
