

FROM THE COMMUNITY ALD

"Behold, I am making all things new." "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old." Isaiah 43:18

I was blessed to serve on Fredericksburg Emmaus #99 that was held November 5th – 8th. This was the 15th Team I've served on and my first experience faithfully following the Emmaus model.

I must admit that I had misgivings. I heard arguments, passionate at times, both for and against the model. The passionate discussions usually centered on Table Chapel and Dying Moments. I wondered how I would feel about the changes at the end of the Weekend.

Early on Friday we took advantage of an extended break as a time to get to know one another at the Tables. When we had the first Table Chapel it was a powerful experience, perhaps because we were already comfortable with one another due to our earlier, unscripted discussions. We had two other Table Chapels, both in response to Talks and both at the request of the Pilgrims. Upon reflection, I don't recall a more powerful and intense Table Chapel experience. It was not manufactured and was entirely the workings of the Holy Spirit.

At Dying Moments there were a number of readings that were no longer present. I presume they had been added over time but their absence allowed us more time with our thoughts focused on the cross. We didn't nail our sins to the cross as we had in the past but in the taking of the bread and laying it at the foot of the cross the Pilgrim response was just as emotional and authentic as I recall from my Walk and previous Teams.

After Candlelight, we gathered in the Chapel for prayer and reflection. The remarks by the Lead Spiritual Director were very brief. Remembering past Walks I was waiting for more when almost as one, the entire room began to move and all of the Pilgrims were on their knees praying in Table families at one of the stations. Trying to keep up, I realized that in the past, we had inadvertently put ourselves between the Holy Spirit and the Pilgrims and the response was far less dramatic than what I now observed.

As the Walk unfolded, I noticed a number of other differences, mostly minor. What I quickly discovered, however, was that the changes actually simplified and enhanced the Emmaus experience and didn't detract in any way.

Were there things I missed from the old ways...of course. But I found in the model a simple elegance in which the Holy Spirit opened the scriptures to Cleopas and his companion and not the Team. One in which the Holy Spirit moved the Pilgrims' hearts and not the Team. Isn't that what we all hope and pray will happen? John Mann FE #29

WALK FEES AND DUE DATES

Application Fee \$25 – Due when you submit the completed application. If this fee is not included with the application the application will not be counted as valid until fee is received.

Sponsorship Fee \$220 – Due, (not mailed, but in the Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is not acceptable to bring the Sponsorship Fee on the night the Walk starts. A check must be written to Camp Happyland the morning of the Walk and is deposited the next day. Therefore, for Emmaus to be good stewards and to be in line with strong business practices, you must send your fees in a minimum of one week before the walk. This fee is tax-deductible, (because you personally are not receiving anything tangible in return). You will be sent a letter, showing your donation, in January of the following year. **Team Fee - \$220** – Due, (not mailed, but in Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is preferable that this is given to the Board Rep, for your Walk, during teaming. **Mail to:** - All payments, applications, fees, correspondence, etc... should be mailed to P.O.
