Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ!

It's that "back to school" time of year for many folks this time of year. It is a time to prepare our children, grandchildren and possibly ourselves, to go back to classes of many types. We go to become better qualified, better prepared, to gain new tools for life; in essence, to become more than we were when we began – to grow.

And of course, as with all things Emmaus, there is a Scriptural basis for this emphasis.

I found three passages that I think are a great basis for an understanding of the importance of coming together to learn, teach, share, pray, and hold one another accountable. Beginning with Colossians 3:16, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God.", moving on to Hebrews 10:24-25,

"And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.", and finally James 5:16, "Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective."

It is not really Emmaus who is calling us into small-group accountability - it is the Word of God. Emmaus just provides us

some good tools and an emphasis that is intended to help us fulfill what God has been calling us to do all along.

When it comes to our continuing journey with Jesus and growing our faith, we all need to be in a constant state of going "back to school."

The process of growing in our understanding of the heart and mind of God is life-long and challenging (and important!). If you aren't in a group – take the plunge! If you are in a group, is it all that it can be and are you reaching out for new people to share in your Christian adventure?

Jesus himself gave us a model in his journey in ministry with those early Disciples. Let us follow in those amazing footprints on our journeys "back to school".
