"The Candy Store"

"O taste and see that the Lord is good; happy are those who take refuge in him." Psalm 34:8

THE REAL PROPERTY AND ADDRESS.

When I was young I loved to go to a candy store and spend my monthly allowance of 20¢. I lived in a very small community and the nearest store was 20 miles away in a town with a population of 1,400. The "candy store" consisted of a shelf or two of candy and trinkets that appealed to kids. It was all I knew but when I was there it seemed like heaven. Sometimes it took me a long time to decide which of the candy bars I wanted. I don't remember what they were but I clearly recall the anticipation of my visits to that store. What a joy to look at all the possibilities. The phrase "happy as a kid in a candy store" comes to mind. Everything around me was good, and though it was hard to choose, whatever I finally picked tasted wonderful.

During each of our Walks this year, there are over 20 Emmaus communities around the world that are conducting Walks at the same time. We all know the transformation that happens to both our Pilgrims and to ourselves through these weekends. But consider the transformative experiences in 20 other communities happening at the same time around the world. There are likely differences between the Walks depending on the state or country in which they occur; small differences reflecting 'local color', but in the main, the same wonderful Holy Spirit filled weekends.

I sometimes think that during these weekends, God must feel as "happy as a kid in a candy store." As He looks down on what is happening in our Walks, He is certainly pleased with all the selections that surround Him. As a kid, my 20¢ would buy me one or two candy bars. Here and now I can "taste and see that the Lord is good" through one Walk at a time. God is present for each of these Walks and to Him, it must be like that candy store of my youth. I know that God anticipates these weekends even more than we do, and I also know that the Fredericksburg Emmaus Community is one of those selections that the Lord can taste.

FROM THE COMMUNITY SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

This year I discovered a web site, "50 Days of Fabulous," that celebrates the 50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. The daily reflections are intended "to celebrate rebirth, light, resurrection, surprise, joy, and the triumph of life over death" and are based on "scripture, saints, art, music, and whatever else inspires" the writers. Many of these reflections have inspired me to consider my own journey and to think deeply about what it means to follow Christ daily.

Today's post (June 1) reminded of the joy of knowing that we are God's beloved. The writer is describing the joyous meeting between Mary and Elizabeth recorded in the first chapter of the gospel of Luke. "In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb." (Luke 1:39-41) Mary's response is a song of praise to God. "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior." (Luke 1:46-47)

The writer concludes the reflection with these words:

"God is in love with us because we are God's, and blesses us not because we have earned God's love, but because God waits for us to leap with joy at the sound of love verbalized in the voices, songs, and lives of others. God loves the parts of us hungry for food and love, outcast from the popular table and from our own sense of worth, and vulnerable among a world obsessed with power." (http://50days.org/)



Application Fee \$25 – Due when you submit the completed application. If this fee is not included with the application the application will not be counted as valid until fee is received.

Sponsorship Fee \$200 – Due, (not mailed, but in the Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is not acceptable to bring the Sponsorship Fee on the night the Walk starts. A check must be written to Camp Happyland the morning of the Walk and is deposited the next day. Therefore, for Emmaus to be good stewards and to be in line with strong business practices, you must send your fees in a minimum of one week before the walk.

Team Fee - \$200 – Due, (not mailed, but in Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is preferable that this is given to the Board Rep, for your Walk, during teaming. **Mail to:** - All payments, applications, fees, correspondence, etc... should be mailed to P.O.
