The Upper Room provided approval to start a Face to Face program in our Community and they sent the first couple of documents that chronicle the process. We have asked questions concerning training and further guidance on Steering Committee requirements. Once we receive answers to those questions we’ll begin building a Steering Committee.

I thank my God every time I remember you. Philippians 1:3

As I write this, I have just returned from serving on FE108. I spent Monday morning sitting on the floor in my bedroom, wearing my crown and reading through all the agape I received during the weekend. As I read, I laughed a bit, I cried a bit, and I praised God a lot. I thanked God as I remembered the laughter, tears, singing, sharing, and praying that took place during those 72 hours. And I thanked God for the testimonies at Closing of the 14 women who are now in their 4th day.

In the Upper Room book *Coming Down From The Mountain: Returning to Your Congregation*, we read that “the church has used the words disciple and pilgrim to refer to the essential identity of the Christian. The word disciple does not mean listener, dabbler, consumer, or aficionado.” Rather, “Disciple . . . says we are people who spend our lives apprenticed to our master, Jesus Christ. We are in a growing-learning relationship, always. . . . Likewise, when the church spoke of the Christian as a person on a faith journey, it did not use the word tourist. It used the word pilgrim. We are a people on the way to God, ultimately to heaven; but in the meantime, we are on the way to wherever we see the saving work of God in the world. The church needs more pilgrims and more

disciples of Jesus Christ. God uses the Walk to Emmaus to turn some tourists into pilgrims and some consumers into disciples. Disciples realize that they are committed to long-term obedience; and by the grace of God, they welcome the challenge. If Christians take discipleship seriously, the church will be transformed and its impact on society will be staggering.” (p. 14-15)

Think back to your Walk and those moments during Closing when you bore witness to the work of the Holy Spirit in your life during those three days. Think again about those two questions – “What has the walk meant to you?” and “What are you going to do with it?” For me, that moment was 18 years ago. My faith journey in my 4th day has sometimes been direct and sometimes meandering. I am inspired and renewed in my own commitment to discipleship by the new members of our Fredericksburg Emmaus community. Come to the November Gathering and meet the women of FE108. De Colores!

Application Fee \$25 – Due when you submit the completed application. If this fee is not included with the application the application will not be counted as valid until fee is received.

Sponsorship Fee \$200 – Due, (not mailed, but in the Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is not acceptable to bring the Sponsorship Fee on the night the Walk starts.

A check must be written to Camp Happyland the morning of the Walk and is deposited the next day.

Therefore, for Emmaus to be good stewards and to be in line with strong business practices, you must send your fees in a minimum of one week before the walk.

Team Fee - \$200 – Due, (not mailed, but in Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is preferable that this is given to the Board Rep, for your Walk, during teaming.
