CLD NOTE

One of my jobs as Community Lay Director is to give the Team Orientation for the two Spring Walks. In January, I did the Orientation for the Men's Team. I happen to be the Board Representative for the Women's Walk, so I gave the Orientation and the Board Rep talk for the Women's Team. Both talks have well thought out, well presented, important information in PowerPoint form. Since someone does them for every team, many of us have heard it numerous times before. I teamed for the first time 19 years ago and have heard it countless times. However, this time God opened my eyes to see something I didn't already understand.

Our Walk – our 72 hours – is supposed to emulate the Walk to Emmaus story told in Luke.

Think back to what happens to Cleopas and his companion. They are leaving Jerusalem going back to Emmaus. They are grieving the loss of their leader. They start the journey to Emmaus preoccupied with all they have seen and heard. They are walking alone. When the pilgrims come to Emmaus on Thursday evening, many are apprehensive, unsure, preoccupied with their lives back home. They may be the only person from their church and may not even know any team members. We endeavor to make the

Walk cloistered – away from – life back home.

Cleopas and the other person are joined by another man – a stranger – “beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.” Jesus Christ, taught them about Himself using the Old Testament scriptures. They spent those hours listening to one long talk given by God Almighty in the person of Christ. During our Walk weekend, we are taught through the 15 Talks about Christ. Remember though, we really only have 1 talk with 15 parts, and that 1 talk is about Christ. Christ used many scriptures but had only one message – Himself. Who writes, prepares, and gives the 15 talks on the weekend? We could say 5 clergy and 10 lay people do it, but the truth is we pray for God to speak through us, and He surely does. God guides and inspires our preparation and stands with us during our presentation. He speaks through us and in spite of us to give His message, not ours!

Cleopas and his companion were disciples of Jesus; they called him a great prophet. But they had lost sight of Him and needed to have their eyes opened and spirits renewed.

We sponsor active Christian friends to Emmaus, and many of them confess at Closing to having lost sight of God or feel separated from God before the weekend. They often talk of how they feel renewed, re-energized, and rekindled after their Walk.

God opened my eyes to see these well planned parallels in the Walk to Emmaus that I hadn't fully seen before. Our job as a Community, as a Board, and as teams, is to follow the Emmaus model to the best of our ability, so we are less present, and God is more present. We put away our

own ideas and goals and submit to God's greater message.

So why don't we sign our agape; because it is God's agape. Why don't we introduce ourselves when we are serving meals; because God is serving. Why don't we wear watches or mention time on the weekend; because that 72 hours belong to God. Why don't we take credit for all the things we do for Emmaus; because God is doing. Why don't we call the weekend Sally's weekend or Bob's weekend; because it is God's weekend. Let's try not to get in His way.

CSD NOTE

As I write this devotion, we are the midst of the spring teaming season. I have the privilege of teaming on FE 113. As I think about this experience I am reminded of the words from Psalm 1:3. We are like trees planted by the streams of water. God has planted the 36 of us to be just that. To be used by God to be prepared to be springs of water to the pilgrims who will come.

Some pilgrims will be spiritually strong and the weekend will be a confirmation of what God is already doing in their lives. Some will come needing a boost. They have gotten a little dry in their faith and we will help them to be freshened like trees along a stream. Some will come needing a lot of water because they have had no growth in a long time. No matter where the pilgrims are in their journey, God will use the teams of both walks to be there to help transform lives. What an exciting time we all will have. DeColores. Brad Phillips TW-42

Application Fee \$25 - Due when you submit the completed application. If this fee is not included with the application the application will not be counted as valid until fee is received.

Sponsorship Fee \$200 - Due, (not mailed, but in the Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is not acceptable to bring the Sponsorship Fee on the night the Walk starts.

A check must be written to Camp Happyland the morning of the Walk and is deposited the next day. Therefore, for Emmaus to be good stewards and to be in line with strong business practices, you must send your fees in a minimum of one week before the walk.

Team Fee - \$200 - Due, (not mailed, but in Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is preferable that this is given to the Board Rep, for your Walk, during teaming.
