CLD NOTE

Yesterday afternoon, the Community gathered at Camp Happyland for Closing for Men's Walk #113. Nine men walked into the Main Chapel to the rousing chorus of "When Those Saints Go Marching In". Closing is one of my favorite parts of the weekend. On Thursday night, we met 9 men who were possibly nervous, unsure of what would happen to them, and perhaps even a bit reluctant. I feel sure all of them were wondering where on God's green earth they had been dropped off!! But on Sunday at Closing, we see the changes that took place over the weekend.

At Closing, we have the great privilege to hear them speak about their experiences. It is indeed a privilege because they speak from the heart in front of people they don't know. Some are more articulate than others. Some shed tears; others are more measured. One thing they all share is how they feel the love of God, often in new and powerful ways, and the love of the brothers and sisters around them.

One man, who came in Thursday joyful and eager, was literally dancing on the stage as we sang at Closing. His testimony was amazing – he was "preaching" to us about the love of God shown to him. The people of his church are in for a treat.

One man talked about forgiveness. He had been holding some unforgiveness in his heart for himself. Because of his experiences during the weekend, he came to forgive himself. He showed me an old cross made from nails and told me it had been given to his uncle at his uncle's own Emmaus walk many years ago. The pilgrim's mother had saved it and sent it as agape for him!

Another man shared that he had given his life to Christ as a teenager in the 1970's. He said he had been on fire, but that flame had gotten much smaller over the long years since then. He said, thanks to the Emmaus experience, that flame is well lit and burning strong again.

All the men talked about forgiveness, God's amazing love, relationships, and brotherhood with other Christian men. What a wonderful sense of strong love and renewal filled the Chapel as we sang and talked and communed together. It brought tears to my eyes to hear these amazing men of God talking.

Did you miss it? Well, you have another chance in two weeks to come to the Women's Walk #114. Come Thursday night, April 4th at 6:30pm and see the women as they begin their walk. Come to Candlelight and carry a candle on Saturday, April 6th at 7:30pm and then come back on Sunday, April 7th to hear their amazing stories of transformation. Yes, I know it takes up most of the weekend. Well, devote your whole weekend to Fredericksburg Emmaus! It might relight your flame too.

Please be in prayer for Face to Face. Start now to look around your congregation, family, and friends to begin identifying people who might be interested in encountering Christ on our next Encounter.



<u>Application Fee</u> \$25 - Due when you submit the completed application. If this fee is not included with the application the application will not be counted as valid until fee is received.

<u>Sponsorship Fee</u> \$200 - Due, (not mailed, but in the Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is not acceptable to bring the Sponsorship Fee on the night the Walk starts.

A check must be written to Camp Happyland the morning of the Walk and is deposited the next day. Therefore, for Emmaus to be good stewards and to be in line with strong business practices, you must send your fees in a minimum of one week before the walk.

<u>Team Fee</u> - \$200 - Due, (not mailed, but in Treasurer's hands), no later than one week before the Walk, but preferably earlier. It is preferable that this is given to the Board Rep, for your Walk, during teaming.
